I CAN'T WAIT TO GO TO HEAVEN

2 Corinthians 5:1-11

<u>Introduction</u>: While walking through a cemetery following a funeral, I saw an inscription on a tombstone I will never forget. I read the man's name, the date of birth and death, then an epitaph that chilled my blood. It said, I AM GONE, I KNOW NOT WHERE TO CONTEND WITH I KNOW NOT WHAT!

Contrast that hopeless epitaph with the promise given to us by our Lord Jesus, "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also." The Apostle Paul, walked in the power of that promise too.

I. PAUL WAS CONVINCED OF THE TRUTH OF HEAVEN

2 Cor. 5:1 For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

II. PAUL WAS CONSUMED BY THE THOUGHT OF HEAVEN

2 Cor. 5:2-4 For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven: If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked. For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.

III. PAUL WAS CONTENT IN THE TRIUMPH OF GOD TO GAURANTEE HIS TRIP TO HEAVEN

2 Cor. 5:5 Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.

IV. PAUL WAS CONFIDENT IN THE MIDST OF HIS TRIALS AS HE AWAITED HIS TRIP TO HEAVEN.

2 Cor. 4:8-9 We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed;

V. PAUL REMAINED COMMITTED TO THE TASK THAT GOD COMMITTED TO HIM AS HE AWAITED HEAVEN

2 Cor. 5:9 Wherefore we labour, that, whether present or absent, we may be accepted of him.
