AUTHOR

Jude, the half-brother of the Lord Jesus (Matt.13:55; Mk.6:3)

- Called himself “the servant of Jesus Christ”

DATE A.D. 68-70

KEY VERSE

Jude 3

“Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort [you] that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.”

SPECIAL FEATURES

- The book of Jude serves as a corridor leading from the Church Age into the Revelation from Jesus Christ
- Reference made to seven Old Testament events and people. He was writing primarily to Jewish believer.

CHRIST IN THE BOOK

- Christ is the One who preserves His own (vs. 1)
- Christ is the One who is denied by false teachers (v. 4)
- Christ is the One who keeps us from falling (v. 24)
