

"Samson & the Lion"

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Few men draw our attention more than Samson. This "Hebrew Hercules" stands tall among the judges that ruled Israel in a day when "every man did that which was right in his own eyes". "In those days there was no king in Israel" and Samson faces life with his "wits" & his "fists".

- Revealed to his wife ("herfer") vs. 18

* Summary of the riddle's meaning : (for us)

"That which was meant to destroy him actually strengthened him"
